

Why are option choices so important?

Grade 5 in Maths


A high average progress score across all of your subjects

In order to support our students with their next steps, we follow the Ebacc at Horsforth School In Years 10 and 11


What is the English Baccalaureate (EBacc)?


- Research shows that a pupil's socio-economic background impacts the subjects they choose at GCSE, and that this determines their opportunities beyond school.
- The EBacc is a set of subjects which are considered essential in keeping young people's options open for further study and future careers.
- A study by the UCL Institute of Education shows that studying subjects included in the EBacc provides students with greater opportunities in further education and increases the likelihood that a pupil will stay on in full-time education. Sutton Trust research reveals that studying the EBacc can help improve a young person's performance in English and maths.
- The government's ambition is to see 90% of pupils studying the EBacc subject combination at GCSE by 2025.

A missing piece of the jigsaw will reduce your eBacc score.






Language options

- All students study either; French, Spanish or Chinese from Year 7 onwards
- These were allocated in Year 6 as part of the transition programme
- These cannot be changed at this stage
- All students take a GCSE in their designated language as part of the Ebacc qualification (there are very few exceptions to this)
- No student can take more than 1 language at GCSE
- There is no option choice to be made for languages in Year 9



Humanities (History / Geography) Options

- Most students are currently studying one major humanities subject (3 hours) and 1 minor humanities subject (1 hour) chosen in Year 8
- They must continue with their major subject (now 5 hours) in Years 10 and 11 and will drop the minor subject completely.
- They do not need to complete an options process to do this.
- A few students however chose to continue with both humanities subjects this year, with History as a 'Depth option'.
- If this is the case, they will need to complete an extra options choice, saying which one they would like to continue with.
- If they want to continue with both, they must pick Geography as their humanities option and History as one of their other 2 option choices.



GCSE Science Options

 All Year 10 and 11 students will study for a Combined Science Award and will gain 2 GCSE Science grades.


Unless:

 They select Triple Science (3 GCSEs in; Biology, Chemistry and Physics) as 1 of their 2 option choices

Please note:

- Students choosing this option will have to study for a GCSE in Statistics in Year 10 and then use the additional time in Year 11 to complete their Triple Science qualification
- Acceptance onto this option course will be determined by prior attainment in Science.
- This is a guided option choice.

Combined OR Triple Science?




What do students study in Year 10?



This options process is only about students choosing 2 subjects (plus 1 reserve) from this list to study in Years 10 and 11



PE and Business option choices

- This year students will be able to choose between 2 different qualifications in both Business and PE.
- Both of these subjects will be offering students a choice between <u>either</u> a GCSE or a Level 2 BTEC qualification studied during Year 10 and 11.
- Students should discuss which pathway would best suit their learning and assessment styles and their future aspirations with the PE and Business Studies staff.
- Both GCSE and BTEC courses allow progression into our Sixth Form to study these subjects at Level 3 / A level.



Which qualification?

GCSE

- 9-1 replaces A*-G
 - More challenging content, taken from the old A-Level courses
- Less or no coursework/controlled assessment
- More exams, mostly at the end of

Level 2 qualifications / BTECs

- Equivalent to a GCSE but graded Pass / Merit / Distinction
- Recognised by employers
- More coursework and internal exams


Advice for choosing options

- Consider something that your child is currently studying as a 3 hour subject depth option and has enjoyed.
- Consider something that we are offering that is a new subject for them (eg Health and Social Care).
- Choose subjects that are enjoyable and interesting, NOT ones which other students are selecting or because they like a particular teacher. We have multiple groups in some subjects so there is no guarantee of who is in which class.
- Consider their favoured learning and assessment styles when selecting either BTEC or GCSE courses.

Making Option Choices - Options online

- All students who picked options online whilst in Year 8, should be able
 to access the options online system already at https://www.sims-options.co.uk (and enter via the Google icon on the system home page)
- If they didn't, they will receive an e-mail next week through their school account with a link to the Options Online system. THEY will then need to follow the registration guide attached to the e-mail.
- All students then need to make 2 option choices and 1 reserve.
- Students can edit option choices online until the deadline of Friday 23
 February (This Friday). Tutor time support will be given on Friday
- Parents can view the options choices via the Sims Parent App but cannot make changes – the student must do this themselves.

Please note...

It is important that all parents/carers and students are aware of the following points:

- Courses will only run if there is sufficient student demand and the course is economically viable
- The number of classes and class sizes may have to be limited for practical reasons meaning that some courses may have limited places
- Unfortunately we cannot guarantee students will be allocated all of their choices
- All final decisions must, of course, rest with the school
- Opting for a course does not necessarily guarantee entry for a particular examination at the end of that course – entries will depend upon student progress over two years
