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#### **Pastoral Updates**

#### **Berlin History Tour Launch**

We are really pleased to launch our Berlin History Tour for May 24<sup>th</sup>-27<sup>th</sup> 2024 for Years 9 and 10 as of September. The trip will cost £875. Some of the places of interest include the Olympic Stadium, Reichstag building, Brandenburg Gate, Stasi Prison and Sachsenhausen Concentration camp. The trip was enjoyed by our current Year 9 and 10 students in May this year and was a real highlight of the year.

Students really benefited from the trip not only in how it closely mirrors the GCSE cold war content but also by providing lessons that will stick with them for a lifetime around some of the atrocities committed in Nazi Germany and Soviet occupied East Berlin.

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#### **Lockers for September 2023**

At the start of the next academic year in September lockers will be reallocated to all year groups. This will ensure that Year 11 students' lockers are located near the sports hall for exams and as much as possible and that year groups have lockers in the same areas of the school building.

Therefore, we would ask that all students who rent a locker from School remove items from their lockers and their padlocks by the last day of term, Friday 21st July. We will also remind students of this in form time.

The site team will cut off padlocks remaining and clear any items from the lockers during the Summer holidays.

Please note that we will not be able to reimburse students for any padlocks that have been cut off and we do not hold spare keys for lockers.

We will write to all students to inform them of their new locker number and location as soon as possible in September.

If your son/daughter has not previously rented a locker from School but would like to do so then please email facilities@horsforthschool.org to request to be put on the waiting list and we will forward payment details in due course.

The (non-refundable) rental cost for a locker is £3 per academic year. Students can also purchase padlocks from School for £5 (the padlocks have 3 keys so spares can be kept at home). They can bring their own padlock from home if preferred.

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#### **Uniform and Jewellery**

We 'sweat the small stuff' and this includes the basics such as incorrect uniform. We have high standards and making sure our basics are right is vital for all other systems to run effectively. There are some students blatantly breaking the policy by not wearing full length black trousers or wearing trainers and jewellery which is prohibited.

I would like to remind you that jewellery will be confiscated until the end of term.

I would also draw your attention to the fact that we have only permitted trousers which are too short due to probable growth spurts in the last few weeks. We will not permit this in September. If parents are buying new uniform for September we ask that trousers comply with policy or students will be given second hand uniform to wear at school.

We do have a second hand and spare uniform stock for parents who are struggling financially.

#### **Important Reminder About the Main Entrance Doors**

A 10 week building project has commenced on the main door entrance to school. This will allow us to extend this area to provide a waiting room space for visitors. This entrance will therefore not be in use again until the new academic year in September 2023.

We will have a small temporary Reception at the Student entrance which will be used by staff and visitors.

We politely request that during this period parents and carers only come to school if they have an appointment and not to drop off anything that students have forgotten for the day. If you wish to make an appointment please phone Reception on 0113 2265454.

Permission to Leave Class Early Passes, Time Out Passes and Toilet Passes Update We have written to give early notice about changes to our systems.

Having students leaving a class early or for time out reasons becomes a safeguarding issue. Students are not supervised when they leave class and we do not have sufficient resources for time out. Students are also missing out on valuable lesson time where there could be other techniques deployed in the classroom that provides students with time out of tasks and space to reset or calm down without leaving the room which is a far better solution. There are times when some students have abused their time out of class and passes are only issued on a temporary basis, they are not permanent. Students have 8 opportunities to go to the toilet throughout the day and at least one every hour. There should only be rare cases where toilet passes are needed due to medical reasons.

As such, all such passes, including toilet passes will expire at the end of this academic year. Parents and carers will need to apply for a pass for the next academic school year when we arrive back to school in September. School staff will consider your request, but you are not guaranteed a pass. These are school based decisions and you will be notified in September if the pass has been granted.

The application form is below and you will be notified of the decision in September. The form closes on 20th July.

Applications will only be considered and an application does not guarantee a pass. Please note that toilet passes will require medical evidence, this can be a note from the GP, a prescription, medicine or other. Details about the medical condition should already be on our SIMs and our first aides are aware of this unless this is a new condition and you have not yet updated the school. Toilet passes will not be issued without medical evidence of need.

Applications for time out passes or leave class early passes will be reviewed by the SENDCo and Deputy Headteacher Pastoral. Students must have either a diagnosed special educational need or exceptional circumstances such as a diagnosed mental health related issue or sudden bereavement.
